Planting advice Wildflower Bulbs

- Winter Aconite Plant 5cm (2") deep as soon as possible. The foliage may be dying back, this is quite normal, the corm is still moist. Soaking in water for a few hours is beneficial.
- Wood Anemone Plant twig like rhizomes 7-8cm (2-3") deep horizontally 10-15cm apart in soil or leaf mould. Soaking in water for a few hours may be beneficial.
- English Bluebell Plant top of bulbs 10cm (4") below surface. Shy to flower in the first year.
- **Lesser Celandine** Plant the small bulbils 4-5cm (2-3") deep.
- **Cuckoo Pint** Plant 10-15cm (4-6") deep in shade or partial shade.
- Wild Cyclamen Plant very shallow shoots uppermost. Top of tuber only 3-5cm (1-2") below surface.
- Tenby Daffodil & Wild Daffodil Plant top of bulbs 10-15cm (4-6") below soil surface. Shy to flower in first year.
- Snakeshead Fritillary Plant top of bulbs 5cm (2") below surface on a thick bed of sand/grit for good drainage.
- Wild Garlic / Ramsons Plant top of bulbs 5cm (2") below surface. Shy to flower in the first year.
- Lily Of The Valley These plants either like you or hate you. Try them in different places in your garden. Plant rhizomes 5-7cm (2") deep horizontally.
- Martagon Lily Plant top of bulb 12-14cm (5-6") down and slightly on it's side so the crown does not rot. Takes a few years to establish and flower.
- Monkshood A handsome blue spike. Plant 7cm (3") deep. All parts of this plant are poisonous.
- **Solomons Seal** These plants either like you or hate you. Try them in different places in your garden. Plant rhizomes 2-3cm (1") deep horizontally.
- Summer Snowflake Plant top of bulbs 10cm (4") below soil surface. Shy to flower in first year.
- Common Star Of Bethlehem Plant top of bulbs 7cm, (3") below soil surface. Shy to flower in first year.
- Nodding Star Of Bethlehem Plant top of bulbs 7cm (3") below soil surface. Shy to flower in first year.
- Single & Double Snowdrop Plant 5-10cm (2-4") deep as soon as possible. The foliage may be dying back, this is normal, the bulb is still moist.
- Wild Tulip Plant top of bulbs 10-15cm (4-6") below soil surface. Shy to flower in first year.
